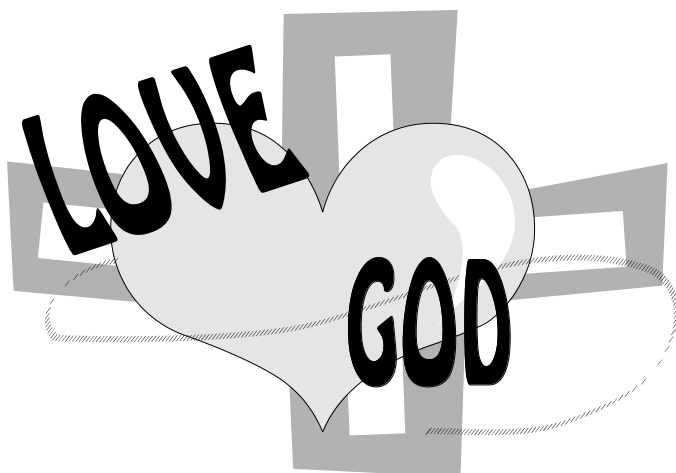

Although not listed in the official Roman Liturgy, MOTHER'S DAY CELEBRATION, is very fitting during the Easter Season. 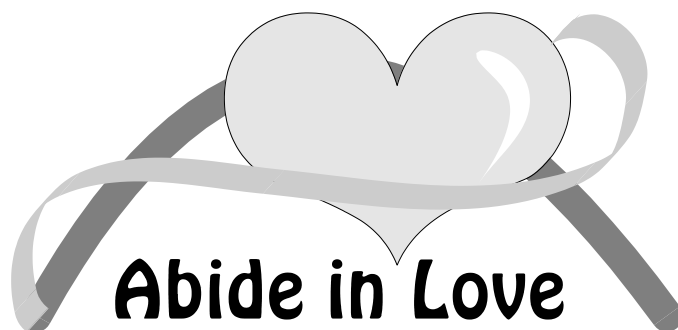
